

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR JUDGE - CHRISTINE BARBER 'BARTINES'

For as long as I can remember I have lived with dogs, but it was not until 1965 that I owned my first Old English Sheepdog. She came from the famous Shepton Kennels of Miss. Florence Tilley and although her brother went on to become a Champion she did not enjoy showing at all. She did, however, produce some lovely puppies for me and thus began my serious involvement with the breed.



In 1974 I mated Bartines Precious Holly to Ch. Fernville Lord Digby and from this litter came Ch. Bartines Most Happy Fella at Jenards who was owned by Richard and Jenny Baker. He won Best of Breed at Crufts in 1977, Top Winning OES Male in 1976 and sired the one time Breed Record Holder Ch. Jedforest Don Carlos. I also bred the Reserve Best Bitch at Crufts in 1980, Bartines Summer Serenade.

It was also in 1974 that I at last managed to persuade M/s. Banks and Bentley to let me have a puppy dog from their lovely bitch Ch. Pendelfold Sweet Charity of Cinderwood. She had been mated to Ch. Aberfells Georgey Porgy and the resulting puppy for me was Ch. Cinderwood Great Gatsby of Bartine. This dog was Best of Breed Crufts in 1978, Top Winning OES in 1980, won five Working Groups and was also a Supreme Best in Show at All Breeds Championship level. I also owned his son Spanish Champion Southview Colonel Bogey of Bartine whose litter brother and sister were both UK Champions. He also sired Champions in both Spain and Portugal.

My judging career started in 1974 and in 1976 I was approved by the Kennel Club to award Challenge Certificates in the Breed. Since that time I have judged, amongst others, the First Championships Shows of the Midland OES Club, the Northern Ireland OES Club and the OES Club of Spain. I have also judged in Germany, Italy, France, Denmark Czech Republic and Holland, including the Amsterdam Winnershow. The first championship show of the Midland OES Club in 1980 was a special day for me as my co-judge was Mr. Norman Harrison of the famous Fernville prefix and on that day we had what is believed a breed record entry of 260 dogs making 468 entries. In 1988 I was also very privileged to be invited to judge the South Island OES Club Championship Show in New Zealand followed by the OES Club of Victoria Championship Show in Australia, a wonderful experience. 1993 saw me co-judging with Mr. Stuart Mallard at the 10th Championship Show of the OES Club of Spain and the 6th Euro Old English Sheepdog Show, a fun filled weekend spent with Bobtail enthusiasts from all over Europe. Since then I have returned to Australia to judge the OES Club of New South Wales 25th Anniversary Championship Show and took centre ring again at the 9th Euro OES Show in Holland in May 1996.

The highlight of my judging career was Crufts 1996, but I have also very much enjoyed officiating at many other prestigious shows.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASS

- In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
- Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
- In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
- In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to & including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class ie. **1st July 2013**
- Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special prize of whatever value.
- If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
 - Withdrawal - the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.
 - Transfer - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age or 18 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or Junior class respectively for the correct breed colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class, to the Open class for the correct breed colour, sex, weight or height.
c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- If an exhibit arrives late & misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may NOT be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of **twelve** and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy & Special Puppy Classes excepted) whether restricted or not.

GRADUATE: For dog which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

POST GRADUATE: For dog which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and which are eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age and over on the day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed. **All dogs accepted NFC must be 4 calendar months or over and KC registered. Full KC details must be given on the entry form.**

SHOW REGULATIONS

- OPENING OF SHOW:** The Show will open at 10.00pm.
- ARRIVAL OF DOGS:** Dogs will be received until 1.00pm, after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional & unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
- JUDGING TIME:** Judging will commence at 11.00 am & exhibitors will be responsible for their dogs being on time for judging.
- CLOSE OF SHOW:** The Show will close ½ hour after all judging has been completed at which time dogs must be removed. **REMOVAL OF DOGS:** Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management then only in very exceptional & unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- COOKING STOVES:** The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting & benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- ENTRY FEES:** Members £15.00 Per Dog for the First class - Subsequent classes with same dog £1.00. Non-Members £18.00 Per Dog for the First class - Subsequent classes with same dog £1.00 .
- PRIZE MONEY:** £125.00, BIS, £50.00 RBIS & £25.00 BPIS
- REFUSAL OF ENTRIES:** The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- PUPPIES:** Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- MATING OF BITCHES:** The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION: Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO For the purpose of the Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Sward confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed & is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO: For the Purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to one breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- REGULATIONS:** No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.

Regs Contd.

15. **PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION:** All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. **OVERSEAS EXHIBITS:** All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - 1) When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - 2) If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - 3) The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - 4) Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - 5) When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - 6) Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so you dog stays well hydrated.
 - 7) Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

18. **NOT FOR COMPETITION:** Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. **DOG FOULING:** Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog/s at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue & within the environs of that event including car & caravan parks & approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
20. **REPLACEMENT OF JUDGES:** If any judge is unable to fulfil an engagement, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a replacement. In these circumstances, exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees will be returned.
21. **RESPONSIBILITY:** The Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any dog or other property whether arising from accident, or other cause whatever, or from any act of omission of itself, its officers, agents, servants or other, or damage done by the exhibits to any person or property.
22. **EXHIBITORS PASSES:** Exhibitors Passes will NOT be sent. If an acknowledgment of entries is required a stamped addressed postcard must be enclosed with entries.
23. **REGULATIONS F9 EXHIBITION OF DOGS:**
 - a) No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car park and caravan parks and approaches.
 - b) The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car & caravan parks & approaches.
24. **EXCLUSION OF DOGS:** If, in the opinion of the Secretary, Show Manager or any judge, any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the Show on the instruction of the Show Management.
25. **BANK CHARGES:** Any Bank Charges incurred through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor concerned. Any exhibitor failing to pay entry fee and/or Bank charges will be dealt with by the Committee of the Kennel Club.
26. **ACCEPTANCE OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION:** The acceptance of a dog for exhibition shall not be taken to imply that the Committee warrants or guarantees that the dog is in a fit state for exhibition or complies with the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition and the Committee shall not be liable in any way whatsoever if the dog is subsequently found either to have been unfit for exhibition or not have complied with the said Regulations.

The Breeders' Competition

offers the following Awards:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC classes 1st, 2nd and 3rd

Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

Grand Final at Crufts 2014



The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	3 points
Second place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	2 points
Third place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	1 point
Best Breeder in Group	4 points
Second place Breeder in Group	3 points
Third place Breeder in Group	2 points
Fourth place Breeder in Group	1 point

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITIONS F (B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations, he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A42.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee. (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination & analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by any official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

TRADE STANDS

The Officers & Committee of The Old English Sheepdog Club do not accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by Stall Holders and/or Trade Stands at this Show. Exhibitors are reminded that products on sale by Trade Stands for the preparation & grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements for the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

VIDEO RECORDING

It is acceptable to video a general overview of the Show and to video the performance of your own dogs. It is also acceptable to video other exhibitors and their dogs provided that consent is given. However, it cannot be considered to be good practice to seek to video where consent has not been given and/or where such recording is clearly unwelcome and unwanted. This would also apply equally whether the person is an exhibitor or otherwise. Should the use of a video become invasive and unwelcome, then the user must abide by any request or direction to cease.
